CLASS DESCRIPTIONS: Spring Quarter (4/21/25 – 6/16/25)

Classes that do not meet the minimum enrollment will be cancelled.

1on1 Sports: After-School Soccer (2nd-5th Grade, Min 10/Max 18)

Join One-on-One this semester for After School Soccer. Skilled and experienced instructors will conduct an exciting and progressive session each week right after school. We will learn age-appropriate fundamentals, rules and strategies of the beautiful game, and have fun scrimmaging while focusing on teamwork, sportsmanship, and FUN!

Akiko: Japanese Club (2nd-5th Grade, Min 4/Max 10)

This Japanese club is for all students who are new to Japanese or have learned some. Students will practice spelling the first 46 letters called Hiragana using provided worksheets. For returning students, Katakana, another 46 letters and Kanji, Chinese characters will be introduced. Each sessions include Japanese traditional and seasonal activities such as Calligraphy, Tea ceremony, Kimono day and traditional festival, Origami, Anime, movie and Japanese characters, Japanese songs and dance etc. Also, we will work on Japanese food (rice ball making, mochi baking or cold noodles etc.) in the classroom and will introduce a small portion of a store-purchased Japanese snacks each class. Please make sure your child's listed allergies are accurate during registration.

BEAM Experiences: Dungeon Master Academy (3rd-5th Grade, Min 8/Max 14)

Learn to be a Dungeon Master and forge your own adventure! In this inclusive class about creative storytelling, kids won't just be playing D&D as an adventurer, they will build magical worlds, draw amazing maps, and weave fantastic stories to bring their campaigns to life. We will practice improv techniques, and learn the rules of D&D so that students can lead their own adventures. Then, working in groups, we will create characters and take turns running games for each other. At the end of the course, kids will take home custom adventure kits to share with friends and family!

Bricks 4 Kidz: Lego Robotics – Creative Contraptions. (3rd-5th Grade, Min 8/Max 14)

Let your imagination run wild with marvelous machines! In this class for inventive kids, we will explore fun new ways to build autonomous gadgets using sensors and motors, and discuss how real-world robots make industries function. Students will design and create original robotic arms, paper airplane launchers, catapults and more. Then, using everything we have learned, we will construct a collaborative mega-ball-mover! Note - this is an engineering and building camp that does not have a focus on programming. This class will be using LEGO Education EV3 Robotics materials.

CreArt Studioz: Paint, Sculpt, and Mixed Media (2nd-5th Grade, Min 10/Max 18)

This season, young artists will explore new techniques, experiment with textures, and bring their ideas to life! From oil pastel resist and watercolor layering to 3D pop-up designs and pattern storytelling, each project is a hands-on journey into the world of art. Through painting, sculpting, and mixed media, kids will build skills, spark imagination, and make joyful, messy masterpieces! Projects will include: 🍷 Juicy Sculptures – Giant, colorful fruit sculptures, 🌸 Blossoms in the Pond – Koi fish & cherry blossoms, 🌄 Springtime Horizon – Tape Art, 🌸 Polka Dot Petals – Kusama-inspired clay flowers, 📦 What's in the Box? – Dream up a 3D surprise!, 🐛 Crawling Colors – Bug prints with chalk & textures, 🗣️ Storytelling in Patterns – Bold & rhythmic Warli designs, 🌸 Bloom & Brush – Pipe cleaner flower vases.

Creative Coding (3rd-5th Grade, Min 5/Max 15)

Creative Coding teaches your child to code by helping them make their own custom video games! Our Project based, multi-level classes are amazingly fun yet very effective in teaching creative problem solving AND emotional resilience. As the students bring their ideas to life, they iterate through the emotional cycle of Coding (idea>excitement>effort> frustration>more effort>triumph!) With our support and positive encouragement. Repeating this cycle not only builds great coders, but more importantly, develops emotional persistence that will help students enjoy taking on new challenges in all aspects of their lives. Students new to coding will participate in the Creative Coding core curriculum, learning the fundamental elements of coding using MIT's Scratch to create their very own computer games! Many parents and educators are realizing that the benefits of learning to code at a young age extend far beyond the skill itself. Through the "brain exercise" of coding, coders build intelligence like athletes build muscles. Just as importantly, they develop stronger problem-solving skills, confidence over technology, and emotional persistence.

Kids Carpentry Seattle (2nd-5th, Min 5/Max 8)

Kids' Carpentry is a hands-on toy building experience designed to teach kids practical woodworking skills with an emphasis on the safe use of hand tools. While kids construct fun and exciting projects, they are also empowered to become independent thinkers--building confidence, self-esteem, and a repertoire of practical skills that will last them a lifetime. At the end of the session kids will bring home one or more wooden games or toys that they have built by hand from scratch.

Kong Academy: Parkour (2nd-5th Grade, Min 6/Max 12)

Get ready for an adventurous journey in Social Awareness, Relationships, and Responsible Decision-Making Skills. The Kong Academy program empowers kids physically, socially, and emotionally through: play, games, and parkour-based movement. Join us as your kids unlock their social superpowers through fitness-focused games and movement-based adventures. They'll dive into a world of teamwork, navigating challenges that foster social awareness and build positive relationships.

Little Hands: Machine Sewing

(2nd-5th Grade, Min 3/Max 9)

Welcome to LHC's Machine Sewing class, designed specifically for students, 1st grade and up! Whether you're brand new to machine sewing or already have experience, this camp is designed to cater to all skill levels. All students will have a full safety overview of essential machine safety protocols, after which new students will complete our beginner sewing curriculum, while the more experienced students can build off their existing skills, taking their sewing abilities to the next level. This class is student-led, and they advance at their own pace with autonomy over the projects they choose to create. Projects include backpacks, phone cases, clothing, accessories, bags, games, stuffed animals and are swapped out every session! This is our most popular and most inclusive class where creativity knows no bounds! **For all new sewers, the first class of the camp is mandatory; please contact Chelsea Cook if your child is unable to attend.*

Math N Stuff: Pokémon Trainers Club

(2nd-5th Grade, Min 8/Max 24)

Pokémon is a card game in which two players take on the role of Pokémon trainers, attempting to outwit and outplay each other using different Pokémon creatures and tactics in the arena. This after-school Pokémon class teaches the basic rules of the Pokémon Trading Card Game! Our young Pokémon trainers will get their own trainer decks to duel their friends. They will add new cards to their decks as they learn deeper strategies and the spirit of the game.

Pacifica Writer's Workshop: Comic Class

(1st-5th Grade, Min 4/Max 14)

Do you have a young artist or perhaps a superhero in the household? In our comic book class, students will learn the basics of comic writing. They will then create their very own comic books.

Rainy Day Dinner Club: Weekly Dinner

(2nd-5th Grade, Min 10/Max 12)

Each week, students learn basic cooking skills while making dinner for their family! Students will create delicious dishes while focusing on the importance of local ingredients, scratch cooking, and natural preservatives while practicing knife skills and kitchen safety. Each entrée will serve 4 to 6 and will be packaged in oven-ready cookware with baking instructions. Please note that we offer vegetarian options upon request during registration. All our meals are nut free but for all other allergies or dietary restrictions please include these while registering. All meals must be refrigerated or cooked within 30-minutes of the class ending. **Note: Students attending an after-care program or leaving the food at room temperature past the 30-minutes run the risk of getting a foodborne illness.** Our Mission is to cultivate enthusiasm for cooking and build a positive culture around family meals! We use the perspective of food, cooking, and nutrition to learn about geography, math, science, and culture, while helping kids develop a life-long love of fresh ingredients and vegetables.
